Epiphany Commemoration Sunday January 8, 2023:

We are now in the Season of Epiphany! The word epiphany means "to reveal." On the first Sunday of Epiphany many Christian churches commemorate the story of the three Magi who followed a star to Bethlehem—the time at which Christ began to be revealed to the world. For seven weeks we are in the Season of Epiphany, from that story of the mysterious star over Bethlehem, to Christ's transfiguration on the mountain. This is a season for us to consider what the scriptures reveal about the life of Christ. As we do, we can find ourselves closer to the heart of God.

One: Do you reject all that is evil, seen and unseen—and all evil works that break apart our communion with God, with one another, and with nature?

All: I do.

One: Do you remain open to faith in God, the One who is Mystery upon mystery, Deep upon deep; the One who is the Source of heaven and earth?

All: I do.

One: Do you open your heart to Jesus Christ—the one born in humble human flesh; the one who lived love and justice, the one who demonstrated forgiveness with his own death; and the one who promises everlasting life through the mystery of resurrection?

All: I do.

One: Do you open your life to the comfort and power of the Holy Spirit, God's presence with us?

All: I do.

One: May almighty God bless you and keep you—your minds open, your bodies secure, your heart generous, and your spirit inclined towards all that is of God. Amen.

First Reading Isaiah 60:1-6

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. ² For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and God's glory will appear over you. ³ Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. ⁴ Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. ⁵ Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. ⁶...They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

Second Reading Ephesians 3:1-12

This is the reason that I, Paul, am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— ² for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, ³ and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴ a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵ In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶ that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. ⁷ Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; 10 so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹ This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, 12 in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

Responsorial Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14

*Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the

East came to Jerusalem, ² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³ When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: ⁶ 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." ⁷ Then Herod secretly

called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared.

⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage."

⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

COMMUNION LITURGY

Pastor: People of God, the light of Christ's Holy Star illuminated Bethlehem—where

Christ was born. Bethlehem means "house of Bread." Christ came for us, and for our salvation, to be the living bread of heaven and the cup of eternal life.

All: Our altar table is also a cradle for the living Christ—who meets us once

again in the bread and in the cup. Here at this table, food for the body

also becomes food for the spirit.

Pastor: This is a table of grace. There is room around it for every soul that was, and is,

and is to come.

All: We come to the table as people who are learning the way of Christ. We

confess that we are not always right. But we share this faith: that those who trust in Christ Jesus will grow in the assurance of God's eternal love.

Pastor: And so, here at this Table we take bread and cup and ask the Holy Spirit to

bring us back to Bethlehem to meet the infant Christ; to bring us back to Judea

to meet the living Christ; to bring us back to the Cross to meet the dying

Christ; and to bring us back to the empty tomb to meet the Risen Christ, body

and blood, love poured out, forever!

All: Here at this Table we remember that Christ indeed gave his entire life as

an outpouring of God's Love—a love that will, one day, renew all things.

Amen.

Pastor: People of God, come to the table!

Pastoral Prayer & Lord's Prayer

One: The Lord be with you.

One: For all that we hold in the silence of our hearts, we come to you in the confidence of quiet, O God, and lift our petitions privately to you. (Silent prayer)... Almighty God, Sovereign of Heaven, shower your blessings upon all people! Move the mountains in our lives, or help to move us so that we might be fully at peace. This we pray in the name of Jesus, who taught us to pray...

All: "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors—and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory forever." Amen.


