


Worship & Veterans' Day Commemoration

Veterans' Day Commemoration

Response Reading & Prayer

One: In commemoration of Veterans' Day in the United States, we honor all of those among us who have served in the military. Today we hear words that have not always been offered, "*Thank you for your service*."

All: Though these words will never go far enough to bring healing for some wounds, it is one small but important way to acknowledge what veterans have given, especially to the nation they serve.

One: Though we hate war—and we may disagree about the justifications for particular wars—it is important to recognize the sacrifices of those who have served on our behalf, and to care for them in return. As people of faith, we acknowledge that we are not yet on the Mountain of the LORD—the place where swords will be transformed into tools of peace. We still live in the "already" and "not yet" world, where the Reign of God is here, and yet its total fulfillment is not yet manifest.

All: We remember the words of Jesus that there will be "wars and rumors of war" in this life. We do not celebrate this failure of peace, but with Jesus we acknowledge that war and ruin is often what we find in our world.

One: And so, we acknowledge the vocation impressed upon many people's hearts: to stand on the line to defend and protect those who would otherwise be harmed by the weapons of war. For many, this legacy of service is one of pride for having served, and for having helped to preserve international civil justice. We also recognize that for others, this legacy includes unhealed wounds of the body, mind, or spirit; living with addictions, broken relationships, dreams that haunt their nights, feelings of guilt because of the ways of war; or deep grief because of what and whom they lost. And so, we pray:

All: God of All Nations, where pain persists, we ask you to heal the wounds of our veterans. Give them peace so they may enjoy the fullness of their lives We offer thanks for our veterans. Help us to care enough to give them the respect and honor they are due, and strengthen our resolve to build a world modeled on your realm, where war will be pursued no more. This we ask in the name of Jesus, the Holy One of Heaven and Earth. Amen.

First Reading

The Book of the Prophet Isaiah 65:17-25

For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. ¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating, for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy and its people as a delight. ¹⁹ I will rejoice in Jerusalem and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress. ²⁰ No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days or an old person who does not live out a lifetime, for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed. ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. ²² They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat, for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. ²³ They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be offspring blessed by the LORD—and their descendants as well. ²⁴ Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear. ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb shall feed together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, but the serpent—its food shall be dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the LORD.

*Gospel Luke 21:5-19

⁵ When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 6 "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." ⁷ They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" 8 And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray, for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them. 9 "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified, for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." 10 Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom; ¹¹ there will be great earthquakes and in various places famines and plagues, and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 12 "But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³ This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance, ¹⁵ for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betraved even by parents and siblings, by relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your souls.

One: This is the Gospel of Christ for the people of God.

All: Come Holy Spirit! Thanks be to God!

O God of every nation, of every race and land, Redeem your whole creation with your almighty hand; Where hate and fear divide us, and bitter threats are hurled, In love and mercy guide us, and heal our strife-torn world.

make it for us: communion with Christ, who gave his life as the bread of

All: Here at this Table we remember that Christ gave his entire life as an

outpouring of God's Love—a love that will, one day, renew all things.

This we pray in the name of Jesus, who taught us to pray...

All: "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors—and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory forever." Amen.

Grant us wisdom, grant us courage for the living of these days,


