### A Meditation on the Trinity from Scripture

One: On this Trinity Sunday, we pause to name a great mystery: God who is one and holy is revealed in the scriptures as a plurality. Not different gods who share a common purpose; but one God whose divine nature exceeds our understanding—and yet the same God who inspires prophets and poets, as well as musicians and ministers to use human words to point towards divine truths.

All: In the book of Genesis, we remember the first creation story, in which Yahweh God creates all things by speaking—by the divine Word—and over the face of the deep, the Spirit of God hovered.

One: Pause now and consider how the same God called you into being, how God shapes you by the living Word, and how God goes with you as the Spirit hovers over the courses of our lives.

[Pause, in silence, to reflect on God's presence in your life]

One: Though God is always with us, we sometimes cannot perceive that. And so, we are reminded in scripture, in the writings of the apostle Paul, to trust in "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit."

All: Be with us, O God, that we may be assured of your love and your presence. By the mystery of the Trinity, may we be reminded that you meet us in many ways, and at just the right time. We open our hearts and minds to your presence with us, now and always. Amen.

### **Celebration of Communion**

Pastor: People of God, come to the table! Christ promised that as we eat this bread

and drink this cup, we not only remember him, but we commune with him by

the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

All: This is a table of grace. There is room around it for every soul that was,

and is, and is to come. We come to the table as a people who are learning the way of Christ. We confess that we are not always right. But we share this faith: that those who trust in Christ Jesus will grow in the assurance

of God's eternal love.

Pastor: Jesus said to his disciples, "my peace I leave you, my peace I give you." Open

your hearts now and may the peace of Christ be with all of you.

All: And also with you.

Pastor: Before we come to the table, let us share with one another a sign of peace.

(All are welcome to show a sign of Christian love to one another, in their own way)

Pastor: Having shown our love for one another, and for God, let us center our hearts

on the sacrament. Together, let us bless the elements. Here at this table we take bread and cup and ask the Holy Spirit to make it for us: communion with

Christ, who gave his life as the bread of heaven and as the cup of eternal life.

All: Here at this table we remember that Christ gave his entire life as an

outpouring of God's love—a love that will, one day, renew all things.

Amen.


