¹⁹ When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of [persecution], Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²² When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." ²⁴ But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." ³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.



Dear Members and Friends of Community United Church,

Easter Sunday was really a great time of worship and community for our congregation! Perhaps you also caught the news story on our church through WJET. They put together a nice segment about us. At the end of which, they encouraged their viewers to come visit us. We're grateful for that kind of coverage! As we journey into the Easter season, let's take a quick look back on where we've been in the Season of Lent.

Worship

- Lent began on Wednesday, March 5 (Ash Wednesday). We had a meaningful evening service and the dispensation of Ashes in the sanctuary. Then the Sundays of Lent explored the following themes:
 - o On March 9: Christ's trials and temptations in the desert
 - o On March 16: Learning not to turn prophetic anger into wrath
 - o On March 23: *Exploring the question of why bad things happen to good people*
 - o On March 30: God's unconditional and prodigal mercy for us
 - o On April 6: The worship of God as right and just; and from our services we go out to serve
 - o On April 13: Palm Sunday and Christ's entrance into Jerusalem
- We also had additional special worship services for the season, which included:
 - o Wednesday, March 19: Our monthly 7:00 PM Resonate service, on hope.
 - o Sunday, March 30: Our monthly 9:00 AM Praise & Prayer service
 - o Holy Week, Maundy Thursday at 6:30 PM: our annual commemoration of the Last Supper
 - o Holy Week, Good Friday at 8:00 PM: our annual commemoration of the Death of Christ
- Children's Church continues to be very well attended throughout the weeks. We are so happy to
 see the number of youth growing in our congregation. This is a good reminder to let people know
 that our ministries are for all ages. A special thanks to Angel Conrad for organizing this ministry,
 and for all who helped to staff it over the weeks. We can <u>definitely</u> use more volunteers for
 Children's Church, so please do let us know if you'd like to help.

- Giving back to the community:
 - Liberty House:
 - Monthly meal preparation and sharing; benefitting U.S. Veterans between homes and jobs.
 - o Service Sunday:
 - Monthly bagged lunches, benefiting our neighbors in need through the Upper Room (in coordination with our sibling congregation: St. Paul's UCC).
 - Ladies Outreach Ministry:
 - Continuous service to children and adults in need in the Erie area; during Lent, hairbrushes were collected for the women's overnight shelter in the city.

Education:

- We had two very well attended "Soup & Simplicity" gatherings (March 12 and April 9). We shared meals, Lenten Devotions, and discussion on our journey of faith as a church body.
- Our Bible Study Group began a study of the Book of Ruth. Join us on the first Wednesday of the month at 6:30 PM in the Fellowship Hall.

House & Grounds:

• You may have noticed driving into the parking lot that winter created a significant pothole at the entrance. We were able to take \$2,300 from our investment portfolio for the repaving project, which will soon be completed.
