Statement of Faith

- All: This is the good news: There is a place in God's heart, there is a place at Christ's table, and there is a place here, and in every welcoming church, for all people. Faith is an illuminating guide, not a warden that imprisons the mind. Whatever is loving, just, compassionate, thoughtful, and healing—all these things are welcome here. Anyone who embodies such things shows forth the glory of God! Amen!

Children's Message

Diversity I: Migrants (Leviticus 19:33-34, NRSV)

- One: People of God, one part of our identity as human beings is grounded in where we are from, where we are now, and why we find ourselves moving about on the earth.
- All: All people are a migrant people when we trace the histories of our ancestors.
- One: The scriptures consistently command followers of God to care for the immigrants in our midst. In the book of Leviticus we read, "*When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien...*
- All: "...the alien who resides with you shall be to you as the native-born among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the LORD your God." Amen.

Diversity II: Genders (The Hebrew Bible and the New Testament)

- One: In the beginning, God made humankind in God's image, male and female God created them. Totally equal. All holding a piece of the image of God within ourselves.
- All: God's image is captured in the diversity of human gender, not in one form of it.
- One: When we take the scriptures seriously, we find a hopeful story.
- All: It is the story of God working to overcome the sins of sexism and patriarchy; and the story of God raising up women as leaders of the people of God.
- One: We celebrate Sarah, through whom the generational promises of God manifested: a child, a priestly nation, and blessings to all the people of the world.
- All: We celebrate Hagar, who was long marginalized, but was seen by God and was carried into a promise and story of her own—now remembered by Judaism, Christianity, and Islam alike.
- One: We celebrate the prophetess Miriam, whose song of victory carried the Israelites onward beyond their captivity in Egypt.
- All: We celebrate Deborah, the prophetess and great judge of Israel. By her wisdom and rule, the people went from warfare to decades of peace.
- One: We celebrate Ruth and Naomi, who bound themselves together as a family to survive in a time of tragedy. Through their cunning and strength, the lineage of Israelite royalty would come from Ruth, the Gentile migrant, and Naomi her mother-in-law.
- All: We celebrate Esther, who found herself in a time of national peril and persecution. She heeded the call to be God's agent of salvation "in such a time as this"—rising to become Queen and liberating her people.
- One: We celebrate Elizabeth, who received the promise of the angel that her child would prepare the way of the Messiah.
- All: We celebrate Mary, the mother of Christ; whose consent to birth the Messiah would set her forth as the mother of the Church—holding Emmanuel in her arms in infancy, and holding Emmanuel's lifeless body as he was lowered from the cross. Indeed, as Mary sang, all generations shall call her blessed.
- One: We celebrate Mary Magdalene, the Apostle to the Apostles—the first person to encounter the resurrected Christ and to proclaim the good news of the resurrection.
- All: Inspired by these women, we stand for gender equality as a matter of our faith. We renounce sexism, patriarchy, and discrimination based on any gender bias. With Mary the Mother of Jesus we proclaim, "God has brought down the rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble." Amen!

Diversity III: People with Disabilities (John 9:1-3, NRSV)

- One: We turn now to consider our abilities and disabilities. The scriptures teach us that all of us have different gifts and different abilities. But we often struggle with the question, "Why is there sickness, disability, and suffering on earth, especially if God is good and loving?"
- All: Some people believe that anything (or anyone) unwell, or living with limitations, must be the result of sin. But this is not what we find in the teachings of Christ.
- One: Remember the story from the Gospel of John: "As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, 'Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?' Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him."
- All: In this story, "God's works" manifested in a miracle of restoring sight. But "God's works" aren't limited to physical healings. Even Jesus did not equate real faith with a life of only miracles.
- One: "God's works" come through all of us, and in many ways.
- All: God's hospitality works through us when we make buildings accessible for those who cannot walk.
- One: God's healing works through us when we make health care and treatment more available to people with different needs.
- All: God's blessings work through us when we tend to those who need our help.
- One: And above all, God's grace, love, and wisdom work through all of us, no matter how differently we are abled. May we live into this vision of living on earth as it is in heaven.
- All: Amen!

Diversity IV: Ethnic and Racial Diversities (Acts 17:24-28, The Message)

- One: We have affirmed that all people are made in the image and likeness of God—all equal in value; all worthy of respect; all royal children of God.
- All: And yet, through human sinfulness, we have too often perpetuated inequality, servitude, and prejudice on the basis of skin color, country of origin, and culture.
- One: Lord have mercy! Christ have mercy! Lord have mercy!
- All: Lord have mercy! Christ have mercy! Lord have mercy!
- One: Listen to the truth of Scripture from the Book of Acts: "Starting from scratch, God made the entire human race and made the earth hospitable, with plenty of time and space for living so we could seek after God, and not just grope around in the dark but actually find God. God doesn't play hide-and-seek with us. God is not remote; God is near. We live and move in him!"
- All: The God of all creation is the God of all people. The original blessing, "Let there be..." allowed all things to develop, grow, and change. Though we are one human race, our adaptations on the earth have created a colorful palette of humanity, and our cultures and languages have created beauty and richness upon the earth. Amen.

*Diversity V: LGBTQ+ (Luke 10:25-37, NRSV)

²⁵ An expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶ He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" ²⁷ He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸ And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

²⁹ But wanting to vindicate himself, he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" ³⁰ Jesus replied, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and took off, leaving him half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. ³² So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other other side. ³³ But a Samaritan while traveling came upon him, and when he saw him he was moved with compassion. ³⁴ He went to him and bandaged his wounds, treating them with oil and wine. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him, and when I come back I will repay you whatever more you spend.' ³⁶ Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" ³⁷ He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise.
