First Reading

The Book of Acts 2:1-4, 43-47

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. ⁴³ Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵ they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

A Meditation on Acts 2

One: In our first reading today, we are offered a glimpse of what the first generation of the church was like. Two thousand years later, we are their legacy. Do we see ourselves reflecting their core ministries?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: When the Holy Spirit first came upon the apostles and disciples, they were able to speak in tongues and languages so that others could understand the good news of Jesus Christ. Sometimes 'speaking in tongues' means finding new ways to communicate. How might we, as a church, find new ways to communicate so that more people can encounter the goods news of Christ?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: To be the church is to be the Body of Christ. That requires all of us. Listen for the Spirit to speak, now—how is God calling *you* to embody the power and grace of Christ, in this church?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: For two thousand years, the ministries of the Body of Christ have been at work to reveal the Reign of God—on earth as it is in heaven. These are our days, and God is inviting us to do such work. Let us rise, now, in spirit or body to prepare our hearts to hear Christ's command: to go out into the world as his loving presence.

(From "A Prayer of Oscar Romero")

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him, but they doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

A Responsive Reading on the Life of the Church

- One: It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.
- All: Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection.
- One: No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the Church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything.
- All: This is what we are about: we plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.
- One: We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities.
- All: We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.
- One: It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.
- All: We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker.
- One: We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs.
- All: We are prophets of a future that is not our own. Amen.
