First Reading

The Book of Genesis 12:1-9

Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. ²I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. ³I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." ⁴So Abram went, as the LORD had told him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. ⁵Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot and all the possessions that they had gathered and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran, and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, ⁶Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. ⁷Then the LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him. ⁸From there he moved on to the hill country on the east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east, and there he built an altar to the LORD and invoked the name of the LORD. ⁹And Abram journeyed on by stages toward the Negeb.

A Guided Meditation on our First Lesson

One: People of God, think again to the story we just heard from the Book of Genesis. In it, we find the characters of Abram and Sarai. They will later be renamed Abraham and Sarah. According to the story, God called them to leave their homes, and their families, and to journey into a new land. Think, now, of times when you had to leave the familiar and go into new places. How did you feel? Why did you have to go? How did that alter the course of your life?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: The promise of God to Abram and Sarai is that they would become a great nation, and that they would become a blessing to all the families of the earth. And yet, that great nation did not rise until generations after Abram and Sarai took their final breaths. What is more, there are still shores and souls of this world that are awaiting blessing. Think now of our own lives. Do we expect God to work more like a vending machine, or as the one who works through the courses of time? What would it mean to have a life of faith that is as patient as it is expectant of blessings?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: Let us sing once more our song of reflection, "Step by Step," and now draw on this song as a prayer to reframe how we might understand the leadings and promises of God.

All: God loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of the steadfast love of the LORD. Amen!

*Gospel Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. 10 And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with Jesus and his disciples. 11 When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" 12 But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous but sinners." 18 While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died, but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." 19 And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. 20 Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, ²¹ for she was saying to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." ²² Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And the woman was made well from that moment. ²³ When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, ²⁴ he said, "Go away, for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. ²⁵ But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. ²⁶ And the report of this spread through all of that district.

One: This is the Gospel of Christ for the people of God.

All: Come Holy Spirit! Thanks be to God!

outpouring of God's love—a love that will, one day, renew all things.


