Mothers' Day Litany:

One: To those who gave birth this year to their first child—we celebrate with you. To those who have lost a child – we mourn with you. To those who are in the trenches with little ones every day and wear the badge of food stains – we appreciate you. To those who have experienced loss through miscarriage, failed adoptions, or running away—we mourn with you. To those who walk the hard path of infertility, fraught with pokes, prods, tears, and disappointment – we walk with you. Forgive us when we say foolish things. We don't mean to make this harder than it is.

All: To those who are foster moms, mentor moms, and spiritual moms – we need you. To those who have warm and close relationships with your children – we celebrate with you.

One: To those who have disappointment, heart ache, and distance with your children – we sit with you. To those who lost their mothers this year – we grieve with you. To those who experienced abuse at the hands of your own mother – we acknowledge your experience.

All: To those who lived through driving tests, medical tests, and the overall testing of motherhood – we are better for having you in our midst. To those who will have emptier nests in the upcoming year – we grieve and rejoice with you. And to those who are pregnant with new life, both expected and surprising –we anticipate with you.

One: This Mother's Day, we walk with you. Mothering is not for the faint of heart and we have real warriors in our midst. We remember you. Amen.

Song of Reflection

"Hymn of Promise" #515

In the bulb there is a flower; in the seed, an apple tree; In cocoons, a hidden promise; butterflies will soon be free! In the cold and snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody; There's a dawn in every darkness bringing hope to you and me. From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

In our end is our beginning; in our time, infinity; In our doubt there is believing; in our life, eternity; In our death, a resurrection; at the last, a victory, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see. One: *Do you believe in God?* This question has been asked and answered in many different ways.

All: Some have found God in nature. Some have thought of God as just a bigger, stronger version of us. Some have said God is completely unknowable. Some have sought to image God in statues or paintings, or in theologies that seek to make God 'make sense.' In this church, we dare to believe that God is still speaking; and that God is still being revealed to us through the witness of Christ and the presence of the Holy Spirit.

One: Consider, now, a story about how the apostle Paul once invited Greek and Roman people to think in new ways about God. Namely, that God transcends idols and altars, and that this God has been revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. The Book of Acts tells the story this way:

²² Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely spiritual you are in every way. ²³ For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶ From one ancestor he made all peoples to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷ so that they would search for God and perhaps fumble about for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸ For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we, too, are his offspring.'"

One: Pause for a moment to consider Paul's call to 'search for God' as an invitation that is also for you. Ponder his words again—that "perhaps we might search for God, and *find* God, who is not far from us."

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: Is our faith open enough to allow God to be wonderfully expansive? To show up as God will, in loving and surprising ways? Or have we slipped into making God small enough to fit in human theologies—sometimes theologies that make God out to be cruel and unforgiving?

[Pause for silent reflection]

One: Be open, now, to search for God without restraint. Let us open our hearts to what Jesus reveals about God. Please rise in spirit or body to sing of our ongoing search for God, and then remain standing for the good news of Christ, for all of God's people.

Seek ye first the kingdom of God and its righteousness, And all these things shall be added unto you; *Allelu, alleluia!*

Ask and it shall be given unto you, seek and ye shall find, Knock and the door shall be opened unto you; *Allelu, alleluia!*

*Gospel Lesson: John 14:15-21

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷ This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him because he abides with you, and he will be in you. ¹⁸ "I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. ¹⁹ In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. ²¹ They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me, and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them."

One: This is the Gospel of Christ for the people of God.

All: Come Holy Spirit! Thanks be to God!

Celebration of Communion

Pastor: People of God, come to the table! Christ promised that as we eat this bread

and drink this cup, we not only remember him, but we commune with him by

the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.

All: This is a table of grace. There is room around it for every soul that was,

and is, and is to come. We come to the table as a people who are learning the way of Christ. We confess that we are not always right. But we share this faith: that those who trust in Christ Jesus will grow in the assurance

of God's eternal love.

Pastor: The peace of Christ be with all of you.

All: And also with you.

Pastor: Before we come to the table, let us share with one another a sign of peace

(All are welcome to show a sign of Christian love to one another, in their own way)

Pastor: Having signaled our love for one another, and for God, let us center our hearts

on the sacrament. Together, let us bless the elements. Here at this table we take bread and cup and ask the Holy Spirit to make it for us: communion with Christ, who gave his life as the bread of heaven and as the cup of eternal life.

All: Here at this table we remember that Christ gave his entire life as an

outpouring of God's love—a love that will, one day, renew all things.

Amen.

Pastoral Prayer and Lord's Prayer ("Debts and Debtors")

One: The Lord be with you.


Let there be peace on earth,
