Responsive Meditation

One: As we turn to the scriptures, now, we pause to intentionally open our hearts and minds to listen for the still-speaking Word of God. Not just the words on the page, but the living Word who meets us in our contemplation. Today, we begin with the Book of Revelation. By tradition, it is attributed to the apostle John. This book is a series of visions of heaven and earth, using poignant symbols to communicate an enduring spiritual truth: that the Reign of God will ultimately prevail over the injustices of the earth. By these visions, we are invited to live in hope, not fear.

All: Living Word of God, meet us with your holy wisdom as we consider these ancient visions of hope. As we do, may we be encouraged by these glimpses of heaven. Amen.

First Reading

The Book of Revelation 21:10-11; 22-26

¹⁰ And in the spirit [the angel] carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. ¹¹ It has the glory of God and a radiance like a very rare jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal. ²² I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. ²³ And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. ²⁴ The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. ²⁵ Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. ²⁶ People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations.

Responsive Meditation

One: When the Book of Revelation was written and shared at the end of the first century, it was in a time of great uncertainty for early followers of Christ. Many of the apostles had been martyred. There was no centralized church, only a network of churches of many different kinds of people, seeking to walk by the light of the Gospel. They often watched as their faith was persecuted. We do not live in such times. But our faith is still often challenged. The way of love is threatened by divisions in society and factions in local communities. The way of love is assaulted by senseless violence on our streets and in our homes. The way of love is assailed by both apathy and quick tempers. It can feel as if faith offers no real refuge.

All: In such a time as this, we turn to the scriptures to remind us that all is not lost, and that our ultimate destiny is secure in the Reign of God—and we dare to believe that Christ's reign shall have no end.

Second Reading

The Book of Revelation 22:1-5

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month, and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. ³ Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; ⁴ they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. ⁵ And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever.

Reflection The Promise of the Holy Spirit - We Are Never Alone

One: Our scripture readings today bring us hope in two ways. First, the Book of Revelation offered us the promise that God's reign will endure forever. In the end, we will be secure and at peace. Even so, our Gospel reading moves our faith from visions of heaven to life on earth. The Gospel of John promises us that the Spirit of God will be given to us so that we are never alone.

All: As followers of Christ, individually and as the church, collectively, the Spirit is with us. We are not alone. We affirm that our primary identity is as children of God and members of the Body of Christ. By this identity we love and serve the world as Christ's hands and feet and love.


