Memorial Day Litany

- One: Before we begin our worship today, we pause as a people of faith who live in this country, the United States. We live in a time when the lion has not yet laid down with the lamb, and swords have not yet been transformed into tools of cultivation.
- All: We live in an "in-between time" of the *already* and *not yet.* The Reign of God is *already* here through the life of Christ and the presence of the Holy Spirit. Even so, the Reign of God is *not yet* fully here, as nations still rage in wars and conflicts; and people still suffer terrible losses each and every day.
- One: In the Book of Ecclesiastes, the Teacher writes, "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born and a time to die... a time to mourn and a time to dance... a time for war and a time for peace." These are descriptions of our lives. We live in the wheel of life, caught between the ways of sorrow and the ways of happiness. We do well when we come alongside those who are mourning.
- All: In this country, on this day, we remember that many people have died in the cause of protecting their nation, especially through their service in the military.
- One: We call this day, Memorial Day, remembering those who have fallen in the service of others, with a willingness to sacrifice for the common good of one's neighbor—regardless of creed, color, identity, or station. We pause now to remember those who have lost their lives in the service of others.

[Pause for Silent Reflection]

- One: The history of every nation is complicated by both strengths and errors (past and present). Let us remember—and hope—that those who feel the call to serve in the military do so for the love of neighbor. They do not wear the uniform with an intention, or goal, of subjugating others. When their lives are lost, help us to be a source of strength and comfort for all whom they loved.
- All: May we never confuse 'right' with 'might.' May we always work towards peace so that others need not die. May we never fail to remember the lives of those that were taken by acts of war, or in times of service. And may the day come when the lives of friends and enemies rise in the healing power of divine love. Amen.

A Reflection on the Pentecost

- One: Today, Christians around the world celebrate Pentecost in a special way, believing that the Holy Spirit of God came upon Christ's apostles and disciples—*as Jesus promised*—to give birth to the body of Christ on earth.
- All: As Christ sent the apostles and disciples out to proclaim the good news, God's Spirit has continued to enliven the hearts and minds of those who hear the call to live on earth as it is in heaven, and to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ.
- One: Pentecost is first a Jewish holy day, fifty days after Passover. But it was on this day that something new happened among the followers of the resurrected and ascended Christ. Spirit came in powerful ways! Consider one telling of the first Pentecost, written by Saint Luke, who also authored the Book of Acts. He tells the story this way:

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵ Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶ And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷ Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹² All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

¹⁴ But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Fellow Jews and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵ Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷ 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. ¹⁸ Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹ And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. ²⁰ The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. ²¹ Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.

Celebration of Communion

- Pastor: People of God, come to the table! Christ promised that as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we not only remember him, but we commune with him by the power and presence of the Holy Spirit.
- All: This is a table of grace. There is room around it for every soul that was, and is, and is to come. We come to the table as a people who are learning the way of Christ. We confess that we are not always right. But we share this faith: that those who trust in Christ Jesus will grow in the assurance of God's eternal love.
- Pastor: Jesus said to his disciples, "*my peace I leave you, my peace I give you*." Open your hearts now and may the peace of Christ be with all of you.

All: And also with you.

- Pastor: Before we come to the table, let us share with one another a sign of peace. (All are welcome to show a sign of Christian love to one another, in their own way)
- Pastor: Having shown our love for one another, and for God, let us center our hearts on the sacrament. Together, let us bless the elements. Here at this table we take bread and cup and ask the Holy Spirit to make it for us: communion with Christ, who gave his life as the bread of heaven and as the cup of eternal life.

All: Here at this table we remember that Christ gave his entire life as an outpouring of God's love—a love that will, one day, renew all things. Amen.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors—and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory forever." Amen.


