Invocation

First Reading

The Book of the Prophet Isaiah 7:10-15

Again the Lord spoke to [King] Ahaz, saying, ¹¹ "Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." ¹² But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test." ¹³ Then Isaiah said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals that you weary my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel. ¹⁵ He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good.

*Gospel Luke 1:26-38

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. 30 The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." 34 Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" 35 The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. 36 And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

Communion

Pastor: People of God, Mary accepted God's Word to her from the angel Gabriel, but only after she was greeted as favored one, after she processed being perplexed, and after she confronted her own humanity. As we read the story, her consent seemed to happen in the breadth of a heartbeat.

All: May we who face our humanity on a daily basis, and find ourselves perplexed by God's message of favor, be patient with ourselves and with one another in process.

Pastor: People of Christ, the Child promised to Mary, filled, and continues to fill, hearts longing for stability and belonging.

All: May we, like Mary, come to accept God's presence in our lives by finding that which we seek in the birth and nurture of Love: God's Word, God's Christ, God's Presence.

Pastor: People of Spirit, for whom nothing is impossible with God, we live in hope by doing the next right thing before us. We gather at this Table, we take this Bread, the bread of heaven; and we take this Cup, the cup of transformation; and we eat, and we drink, in communion with all the saints present with us in the process.

All: In holy communion may we receive Divine Love that in our being we may give birth to love for ourselves, for one another and for the transformation and fulfillment of all Life.

Pastor: Family of God, Come to the Table.


