Litany of the Word

One: People of God, we center our hearts now on the ancient scriptures of our tradition. These are texts that connect us with our Jewish and Christian spiritual ancestors.

All: The Word of God comes to us as we reflect, study, and pray through the texts. Reading or hearing the Bible is only the first step.

One: Today, we encounter a letter from the Apostle Paul to the people of Ephesus, the Ephesians. The people of the church in Ephesus were from many backgrounds—both Jewish and Gentile. This meant that, very often, they did not understand one another, and were sometimes easily upset by one another. The Apostle Paul's ministry to them was to help them understand their unity in Christ. Although each member of the church had a unique individual identity, Paul was calling them to understand that their common identity as children of God is really what unites them through Christ.

All: Spirit of God, grant us the wisdom to find meaning in the scriptures for our lives today. Meet us as we seek understanding. Amen.

Reading Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 1:3-14 (The Message)

How blessed is God! And what a blessing he is! He's the Father of our Master, Jesus Christ, and takes us to the high places of blessing in him. Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, to be made whole and holy by his love. Long, long ago he decided to adopt us into his family through Jesus Christ. (What pleasure he took in planning this!) He wanted us to enter into the celebration of his lavish gift-giving by the hand of his beloved Son.

⁷⁻¹⁰ Because of the sacrifice of the Messiah, his blood poured out on the altar of the Cross, we're a free people—free of penalties and punishments chalked up by all our misdeeds. And not just barely free, either. *Abundantly* free! He thought of everything, provided for everything we could possibly need, letting us in on the plans he took such delight in making. He set it all out before us in Christ, a long-range plan in which everything would be brought together and summed up in him, everything in deepest heaven, everything on planet earth.

¹¹⁻¹² It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living, part of the overall purpose he is working out in everything and everyone.

¹³⁻¹⁴ It's in Christ that you, once you heard the truth and believed it (this Message of your salvation), found yourselves home free—signed, sealed, and delivered by the Holy Spirit. This down payment from God is the first installment on what's coming, a reminder that we'll get everything God has planned for us, a praising and glorious life.

Reflection

One: God had us in mind before the world was made; settled on us as the focus of His love to be made whole and holy by His love. God, our Creator knows everything about us. God knows all the things we care about, the things we need, the things that keep us up at night – because WE are the focus of His love. God is paying attention.

(Silent reflection)

One: Because of Jesus' sacrifice, we're a free people. Free of penalties and punishments. And not just barely free, either! Abundantly free! This is God's plan. That we would not be crushed under the burden of our mistakes, imperfections, or weaknesses. That we should not have to be punished by God and we should not punish ourselves.

[Silent reflection]

One: Part of "glorious living" is loving each other. As we allow God to heal our hearts and minds, and as we forgive ourselves and learn to walk in God's freedom – let us also forgive others who have hurt us. God can and will help us to release these hurts. Even though it's tempting to want justice when we've been hurt, let us receive God's grace and trust that God is working all things out for our good.

"5 And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, ⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him. ⁷ And he answers from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything.' 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything out of friendship, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.9 "So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ¹⁰ For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. 11 Is there anyone among you who, if your child asked for [2] a fish, would give a snake instead of a fish? 12 Or if the child asked for an egg, would give a scorpion? 13 If you, then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"


